Psalm 34:18-20 (New International Version)

- ¹⁸ The LORD is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit.
- ¹⁹ A <u>righteous</u> man may have many troubles, but the LORD delivers him from them all;
- ²⁰ he protects all his bones, not one of them will be broken.

Psalm 37:29-31 (New International Version)

- ²⁹ the <u>righteous</u> will inherit the land and dwell in it forever.
- The mouth of the righteous man utters wisdom, and his tongue speaks what is just.
- 31 The law of his God is in his heart; his feet do not slip.

Psalm 112:5-7 (New International Version)

- ⁵ Good will come to him who is generous and lends freely, who conducts his affairs with justice.
- ⁶ Surely he will never be shaken;

a <u>righteous</u> man will be remembered forever.

⁷ He will have no fear of bad news; his heart is steadfast, trusting in the LORD.

Proverbs 24:15-17 (New International Version)

- ¹⁵ Do not lie in wait like an outlaw against a <u>righteous</u> man's house, do not raid his dwelling place;
- for though a <u>righteous</u> man falls seven times, he rises again, but the wicked are brought down by calamity.

James 5:15-17 (New International Version)

¹⁵And the prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise him up. If he has sinned, he will be forgiven. ¹⁶Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a <u>righteous</u> man is powerful and effective.

Psalm 37:22-24 (New Living Translation)

- ²² Those the LORD blesses will possess the land, but those he curses will die.
- ²³ The LORD directs the steps of the <u>godly</u>. He delights in every detail of their lives.
